Dr. Dalkilic (Dr. Dal) has been an Associate Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the Temple University School of Medicine & has been working as a psychiatrist at St. Elizabeths Hospital & Renfrew Center. He has been a Diplomate of American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology since 2000 & has also been serving as Coordinator in the Foreign Affairs Board of Turkish Association for Psychopharmacology.

Dr. Dalkilic graduated from Marmara University School of Medicine in 1993. He completed his Internship at Albany Medical College (1995-96) & Residency Training in Psychiatry at Yale University School of Medicine in 1999. He started MPH training at Yale University School of Public Health and eventually obtained an MPH degree from School of Public Health and Health Services, George Washington University in 2002. Dr. Dalkilic was the director of Schizophrenia Clinic & an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Virginia Commonwealth University School of Medicine during 2005-2009.

He was one of the awardees of the Future Leaders in Psychiatry Program from the Department of Psychiatry of Emory University School of Medicine. He has conducted clinical trials, published in peer-reviewed journals, & presented in national & international congresses. His work and research have focused on student behavior in schools, cultural psychiatry, & psychopharmacological treatment of ADHD, anxiety, mood, & eating disorders. He is also interested in mental health promotion, positive psychology, & resilience.
