

Harold E. CARLSON, M.D. Brief Biosketch

Dr. Harold Carlson received his Bachelor's degree from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and his M.D. from Cornell University Medical College. After internship and residency training at Barnes Hospital/Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri, he served as a Clinical Associate in the Clinical Endocrinology branch of the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland. He then returned to Washington University for fellowship

training in Endocrinology and Metabolism.

After holding faculty positions at UCLA and the University of Missouri, he moved in 1985 to Stony Brook University in Stony Brook, New York, where he is currently head of the Endocrinology division and Professor of Medicine. His research interests have focused particularly on pituitary and thyroid disorders and gynecomastia. He is the author or co-author of 188 papers and book chapters and is a recent recipient of the Aesculapius award for outstanding teaching at Stony Brook. He is a frequent speaker on the topic of endocrine side effects of psychiatric medications.
