



## **Samet KOSE, MD, PhD**

Dr. Samet Kose earned his medical degree at Hacettepe University School of Medicine in Ankara, Turkey. He completed his residency in psychiatry at Dokuz Eylul University School of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry in Izmir, Turkey. Dr. Kose completed his Psychiatric Neuroimaging Fellowship at the Center for Advanced Imaging Research, Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. Dr. Kose translated the well-known Cloninger's Temperament and Character Inventory into Turkish and validated the measure in the Turkish culture. He conducted NIH-funded fMRI studies on social bonding, attachment, parenting behavior, and anxiety disorders. Dr. Kose was also awarded APA's Research Colloquium for Junior Investigators in 2005. Dr. Kose has expertise in areas of social bonding, attachment, personality correlates of psychiatric disorders, empathy, alexithymia, deception, neuroimaging and brain stimulation therapies in psychiatric disorders (VNS, TMS, DBS). Dr. Kose received a National Alliance of Research and Schizophrenia (NARSAD) Young Investigator, the Health Emotions Research Institute Scholars Award at the Wisconsin Symposium on Emotion (Top 15 scientist), APA's Junior Investigators Research Colloquium Award, and American Academy of Addiction Psychiatry (AAAP) Area Director Regional Travel Award. Dr. Kose's current research at the University of Texas focuses on cerebral blood volume mapping in patients with unipolar and bipolar depression and brain stimulation using TMS for treatment of cocaine dependence. Dr. Kose's earlier pioneering work was cited in Katherine Ellison's book entitled "The Mommy Brain: How Motherhood Makes Us Smarter". Samet Kose's "Cummings: A Profile of a Poet" book has received favorable reviews by the literary critics.
